A Patience Island Clambake



My son's girlfriend, Grace had started a new job as a writer at "America's Test Kitchen", a TV show on WGBH in Boston, a few months ago. She also loves to cook and is always looking for something new and creative to try. She came up with the idea of doing a traditional New England clambake, which she had never done before. After a



fair amount of research into the various techniques people have used over the years, she came up with a plan and started to gather the necessary supplies.

The plan was to collect all the materials and meet at our boat at Apponaug Harbor Marina (or should I say, Safe Harbor Marina), load everything onto the boat, and head to Patience Island for the clambake. All went according to

plan and we arrived at our destination in a little over an hour. We set the anchor and used our dinghy to shuttle all the many supplies to the beach.



At that point we started by digging a hole approximately 4' x 4' x 3 feet deep. When I say we, I really mean my son, who is 26, and in great shape. The rest of us gathered a collection of lunch plate sized flat rocks to line the bottom of the hole with. After the rocks were in the hole, we started a small fire on top of the rocks using wood we had brought with us. With time, we built the fire up a bit and kept it

going for a good, solid two hours. At that point the wood had burned down to mostly ashes and it was time to get cooking.

We had about 10 pounds of seaweed which we placed over the hot rocks and began to add all the food in layers. Clams, lobsters, potatoes, sausage, corn on the cob, and some leeks wrapped in bacon were added to the "oven". Everything was covered with a final layer of seaweed and then a wet canvas cloth was placed over that. We also covered the canvas with a pretty good layer of sand after a while as we felt that maybe too much of the heat was escaping. Now all we had to do was wait for everything to



About two hours later it was time to see how things were progressing. We pulled off the sand covered canvas, and began to search through the layers of seaweed for the food. One by one the items appeared and were checked to see if they were done. Everything looked great. The only issue was that for some reason about half the clams hadn't opened. We still aren't sure exactly why. Everything else was cooked beautifully and we settled in to devour the feast.

It was a wonderful day, and a great, unique meal which we all enjoyed tremendously. I really want to thank my son, and especially Grace, for all the work they put in to making this happen. We have spent a lot of time together on the boat, but this was a really fun, unique experience.


