"Rescue at Sea" By WBYC member David Kiernan

My family and I were returning to Apponaug Harbor Marina, where we moor our boat, after a day trip and picnic on the beach on the west side of Prudence island. It was about 6 p.m. and the wind had picked up quite a bit, about 20-25 knots and straight in our face. Waves were about 2 feet and it was slow going. Despite the wind and waves, the sun was out and it had been a beautiful day.

As we slowly headed to our destination, I thought I could see a kayaker in the distance. It seemed foolish to me that they would be out there given the conditions. As we got closer to them it also seemed strange that they weren't paddling. At that point I retrieved the binoculars from below and had a better look. Much to my shock, it wasn't a kayaker at all, but a capsized boat with two people who had been aboard. One of them was in the water and the second had managed to climb onto the hull of the overturned boat. Fortunately, both were wearing life jackets.

We lowered our headsail, started the engine and headed straight for them at full throttle. I was worried because I knew the water was still quite cold, probably 56 or 57 degrees, and I had no idea how long the person in the water had been there.

It took us about 7 or 8 minutes to get to them and we pulled up downwind and called over to assess their condition and see how they were. Fortunately, we had towed our inflatable behind us in order to get to the beach on Prudence. I decided we would put my son in the inflatable and tow it past their boat to pluck the man from the water. As it turned out the wind was too strong and the water too rough for this to work. We then decided to separate the dinghy from our boat and my son would

motor over to their boat. This worked and he was able to grab the man in the water. Unfortunately, although he is quite strong, he was really struggling to pull the fully clothed, soaked man into the inflatable. It took him what felt like an eternity, but he finally wrestled the man aboard. He then went around to the opposite side of their boat and helped the woman scramble into the dinghy.

He returned to our boat and we helped the man climb our boarding ladder. He had very little strength left and even with our help it took him a minute or two to get aboard. His wife got aboard more easily. I think because she had managed to get out of the cold water she was in much better shape. Once we got them aboard, they went below and we gave them dry clothes to change into as well as towels and blankets to warm themselves. My wife and daughter made them hot tea to help them warm up as well. The man was shaking uncontrollably and was quite pale and it took him about 15 minutes before he stopped shaking. As it turns out he was 66 and his wife 63.

They seemed to not really know how their boat had capsized. It was a 19 foot O'day with a 6 h.p. motor. They had taken the sail down and were motoring for Allen's Harbor when according to the woman, the boat had just flipped without any warning. They had a hand held VHF radio and phones, but they were all lost after the boat capsized, and they had no way to communicate their distress. They felt they had been there for about 20 minutes by the time we came along.

As soon as we had them on board, I called the Coast Guard to alert them of the situation. They asked a lot of questions and told us a rescue boat as well as a Coast Guard boat would be coming and to stay on scene. In about 15 minutes a rescue boat from the East Providence Fire Department arrived. The couple transferred to the rescue boat and headed off. A coast Guard boat arrived shortly after and we could hear them on the radio discussing the overturned boat. They decided to leave it there for the night, and attached several glow sticks to it to give it some visibility overnight.

We then headed back to Apponaug, arriving just before dark. We were all excited that we were able to help them out, and that we felt we had done everything calmly and successfully. After discussing it some more, I think the only mistake we made was sending my son over alone in the inflatable. It all would have been much easier if there were two people. Fortunately he was able to do it alone and it all worked out well.

I spoke with the man a few days later and he filled me in on what happened after they left us. The rescue boat took them back to Allen's Harbor where an ambulance was waiting, but he said they felt fine and just wanted to go home. The following day he called Sea Tow to find out if they could get the boat back. They looked, but apparently couldn't find it. The day after that he got a call from the Jamestown Harbor master who told him he had found it floating off the shore of Jamestown. I don't know the details, but Sea Tow was able to right the boat, pump it out and tow it back to Allen's Harbor. Miraculously, their phones

which were in water proof cases were found and still worked fine. The outboard motor however had fallen off and is at the bottom of the bay.

I don't know what lessons can be learned from this, but I did pass on one thing to them. If I am on my boat alone, I always have a life jacket on, and the portable, waterproof, floating VHF radio physically clipped onto me. If I were to go overboard somehow, I would have a means to call for help. They had said everything happened so fast they had no time to do anything. I suspect that is how most of these things happen and if you are smart and a little lucky maybe you have prepared for it.




Figure 1Approaching capsized boat

Right now I'm putting a few things together for a mini excursion for the weekend and we hope you have many joyful summer activities planned as well!


