

Treasurer's Report



For those of you who were unable to attend the WBYC Annual Meeting and missed my report, I wanted to let you know that our club, although hurt by the lack of activities due to the Pandemic this year, remains on solid financial footing, finishing the budget year essentially with a balanced budget (+\$214). Your Board worked very hard to manage to budget and for this reason, the club continues to maintain healthy fund balances.

WBYC fund's operations mostly through your membership dues. WBYC's biggest expenses are related to insurance, yachting associations dues (NBYA, YCA, US Sailing), which provides our credentials and reciprocity, and mooring fees for the Bristol and Dutch Harbor Moorings. Rental fees to the Varnum Armory are a variable cost, as are most other expenses. Racing Fees cover racing program costs and even contributed modest revenue.

The Membership adopted our budget for next year at the Annual Membership Meeting. Anyone who

It has been a pleasure serving the membership once again as your Race Committee Chair for the 2021 Racing season. This year the Summer Series was shortened by one race day due to the way the calendar fell and so the Summer Series had only eleven race days as compared to the usual 12 race days. That said, we kept the throw-outs at three allowing each racer to use their best eight race results for scoring purposes.





In addition, both the Rainone Solo / Twin and the Ladies Regatta were held on holiday Mondays with a total of 15 racers participating between the two events. Unfortunately, we did not have the same cooperation from the 'wind gods" in celebrating the Fred Kerzner "Around the Island Race" and it became necessary to shorten the race at Despair with the majority of the racers retiring. The Fall Series followed with numerous re-scheduling race days due to impending weather conditions, but all in all four races where run and the evenings were spectacular.
