Several Racing announcements were proclaimed at the Annual Awards Banquet and in December's

thought it might be worthwhile to repeat them as they will be the new cornerstone for the 2009 sailing season:

- 1. The F3 Series will be reinstated during the upcoming summer program. The F3 Series consists of three Friday races during each of the summer months. Dates are tentative at the moment but I have submitted 6/12, 7/17 and 8/21 to EGYC and AHYC for consideration.
- 2. EGYC is celebrating their Centennial this summer and on July 18<sup>th</sup> will be hosting the Centennial Regatta. All WBYC and AHYC racers will be cordially invited to participate as it will be one of the qualifying events for the newly created Greenwich Bay Cup. An impressive après-sailing

- social event will follow the days racing schedule. Clearly this is one event which must NOT be missed!
- 3. A new Regatta Series has been established involving participation from all three yacht clubs on Greenwich Bay for the purpose of establishing the "Top Guns" in each Class for the coveted Greenwich Bay Cup. Qualifications are as follows:
  - a. All three races in the F3 Series must be raced and completed [no exceptions].
  - b. Two out of three races need to be raced and completed (choices are the EGYC Centennial Regatta [7/18], WBYC Norton's Memorial Regatta [8/15] and AHYC Dickerson's Regatta [9/12]). If racing in all three events top two finishes will be counted for scoring purposes.

Last, but not least, a few awards and trophies left over from the Awards Banquet are at the Club awaiting picked-up, and there will be an early Skippers meeting on Friday March 6<sup>th</sup> [7PM] to review additional
