The Board has been working tirelessly on



strategic planning for the club. This exercise has never been done, but I feel it is a crucial step to ensure the future of our club. So, what is strategic planning?

Strategic

planning is an organization's process of defining its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to pursue this strategy, including its capital and people.

Strategic planning is the formal consideration of an organization's future course. All strategic planning deals with at least one of three key questions:

- 1. "What do we do?"
- 2. "For whom do we do it?"
- 3. "How do we excel?"

In many organizations, this is viewed as a process for determining where an organization is going over the next year or more - typically 3 to 5 years, although some extend their vision to 20 years. In order to determine where it is going, the organization needs to know exactly where it stands, then determine where it wants to go and how it will get there. The resulting document is the strategic plan.

Currently we have five strategic goals that have been identified by the board. These five strategic goals are viewed as a 3-5 years for completion. Each committee chair has been tasked with creating 3 Tactical goals that support the 5 strategic goals. **Tactical planning** typically focuses on three to five challenging but achievable "stretch goals" that can be realistically implemented during a 12 month period.

In addition to our strategic and tactical planning each committee is working on creating a budget for 2010. We will be presenting this to all members during our Annual meeting. Everyone on the board has been working hard to create these budgets and tactical goals which has never been done before. We are working to put more structure around how the club is run along with streamlining day to day activities.

Don't forget this is your club. Get involved!!

A Note on Dutch Harbor

Most members know that West Bay Yacht Club maintains a mooring near the south end of Dutch Harbor for our members. mooring is first-come, first-served and

cannot be reserved. Please be aware that the Club's mooring is not part of the Dutch Harbor Boatyard and therefore DHBY services are not offered to West Bay members who are using the Club mooring. If you plan to use the Club mooring, be prepared to bring a dinghy and tie up at the harbormaster's dock near the south end of the complex. If you wish to use the Dutch Harbor Boatyard launch or bathroom facilities, we suggest making arrangements (it's likely that money will be involved) with the Boatyard on VHF channel 68.
