Education Corner

Main Trim Doyle J/24 Tuning Guide: Until you start heeling, maintain the boom on centerline. In light winds pull the traveler to windward so the upper batten is 3 to 5 degrees open and the boom is in the center of the boat. As the wind increases, start dropping the traveler and increasing sheet tension. In 10 knots, The traveler will be in the middle of the boat and you will need to apply more sheet tension so the top batten is pointing 3 degrees to windward. When you reach more than 13 knots start freeing the sheet and start dropping the traveler a bit.

How to Boil a Lobster

What You'll Need

- 8 quarts water
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 1- to 1 1/2-pound live lobsters
- 1 recipe Clarified Butter (see recipe below)

Step By Step

In a 12-quart kettle bring water and salt to boiling. Grasp each lobster just behind the eyes; rinse lobsters under cold running water. Quickly plunge lobsters headfirst into the boiling water. Return to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 20 minutes. Drain lobsters, remove bands or pegs on large claws.

When cool enough to handle, place each lobster on its back. Separate the lobster tail from the body. Cut away the tail membrane to expose the meat. Remove and discard the black vein running through the tail. Remove meat from tail. Twist the large claws away from the body. Using a nutcracker, break open the claws. Remove the meat from the claws. Crack the shell on remaining part of the body; remove meat with a small fork. Discard the green tomalley (liver) and the coral roe (found in female lobsters). Serve lobster meat with Clarified Butter.

Melt 1/4 cup butter over very low heat without stirring; cool slightly. Pour off clear top layer; discard milky bottom layer

Tall Ships to return to Newport www.Rlyachting.com



Organizers of the Ocean State Tall Ships Festival 2012, along with state and local officials held a news conference Wednesday at the Newport Yachting Center to announce some of the details:

Richard M. McAuliffe Jr., chairman of the Ocean State Tall Ships board, said about 15 ships are expected along the Newport waterfront from July 6-9.

McAuliffe said eight or nine should be Class-A vessels, the biggest Tall Ships.

Event organizers expect 200,000 visitors, which would mean an economic impact of \$20 million for Rhode Island.

The figures come from a study for Tall Ships America that examined previous visits of the Tall Ships, which came to Newport in 2004 and 2007 and to other ports in the U.S. and Canada.

McAuliffe said Ocean State Tall Ships is looking to raise about \$1.1 million, mostly through corporate sponsorship.

He also said there will be a bidding process through the Newport County Chamber of Commerce for businesses that want to become vendors for the festival.

Among the speakers at the news conference were Lt. Governor Elizabeth H. Roberts and Keith Stokes, executive director of the state Economic Development Corporation.

Next summer in Newport is shaping up as a busy time for sail enthusiasts. Just before the Tall Ships arrive, the America's Cup World Series races are scheduled, from June 23 to July



The **points of sail**, sometimes called sailing positions, relate to the angle between a sailboat's heading, or course, and the direction of the wind. There are three basic courses:


- **beating** (wind is from ahead)
- **reaching** (wind is from the side)
- **running** (wind is from <u>astern</u>)

BASIC SAILING: Rules of Sailing



Right of Way

The arrow indicates the direction of the wind. The black boat is "privileged", and has the right-of-way. The blue boat is the "burdened" boat and must get out of the way.




A sailboat <u>running</u> free must keep clear of one <u>close hauled</u>.


