Racing Committee



We are now past the halfway point of the season though it feels like we just started. Though our weather has cooperated as far as clear, sunny, warm days, the we haven't seen much of the reliable Narragansett Bay sea breeze. The Newport Storm Regatta fell victim to the lack of a sea breeze and the course, which took the fleet to the entrance of Wickford Harbor, had to be shortened on the return leg to Calf Pasture Point when the winds got very light. We had great wind for the Norton Memorial Regatta and the spinnaker boats were able to complete a course that was approximately 18 miles long while the non-spinnaker class sailed a 14 mile course. I'd like to give credit to Tom D'Albora for great sportsmanship. Tom, skippering "Coconut" finished first on elapsed and corrected time but after the race and after realizing that he hadn't passed the Providence Point buoy on the proper side he emailed me and retired from the race.

One of our main events of the summer is our Whaler's Race to Block Island. Though work and travel commitments thinned out our fleet this year we still had a great time. Video has been posted on the WBYC Racing Pages website of the "fisherman's start" in Dutch Harbor showing "Mojo" as a ghost ship drifting past "Sowwannatin" as Joe Landi and crew hoisted anchor and sails. "Mojo" started 3 minutes after "Sowwannatin." "Spitfire" sailed away from everyone and finished nearly 45 minutes ahead of everyone. There was a photo finish for second place. I am awaiting a video of the finish taken by the "Spitfire" crew and will post it on the website as soon as I get it. The traditional dinner at Aldo's was great after which many of us partied until the last launch ride of the night. There were a few that stayed behind and as I understand it they didn't get back to their boat until the sun was nearly up Sunday morning.

Our signature WBYC Monday Summer Series is closer than ever with places in individual races being decided by seconds on a regular basis. After nine races (without accounting for throwouts) the first three boats in the spinnaker class span only 2 points. "Civil Action" has 29 points, "Velocity" has 30 points, and "Thunder" has 31 points. In the non-spinnaker class "Obadiah" leads the

series with 31 points; “Thora” has 34 points; and “Mighty Moose” is third with 36 points. I hope everyone is enjoying the great photos of the Monday night action taken by our own pro Jim Wright that are on the racing pages website. Visit it if you haven’t.

We have three Saturday races in August, the rescheduled Solo/Twin Regatta on the 11th, the Fantastic Plastic Regatta on the 18th and the Lady Skipper’s Regatta on the 25th. If you haven’t entered and are interested get your entries in to me. If you haven’t raced before these are good events in which to get your feet wet. Just call me and I’ll help you in anyway I can.

Windsurfers will dominate kiting-gold medalist

If kitesurfing replaces windsurfing at the 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, most of the competitors currently on surfboards will also dominate the new discipline, the women's gold medallist said on Tuesday.

"If they include kitesurfing, it will be the same people who will be competing, as in the world there are no more than 20 people (at the top level) ... I think wind surfing will come back for 2020," said Spain's Marina Alabau.

In May, the International Sailing Federation (ISAF) announced men's and women's kiteboarding would replace the RS:X sail board at the 2016 Games but a vote in November may yet see the decision reversed.

The ISAF is also facing a legal challenge by windsurfing chiefs to the vote that could force an about-turn.

In windsurfing, competitors skim across the surface on a surfboard and hold onto a connected sail, whilst in kiteboarding, they stand on a much smaller board and are propelled by a kite which can lift them up in the air.

Many of the competitors at the wind surfing regatta on England's south coast said they wanted their discipline to remain, and that kitesurfing was more a "fun" sport which had not yet matured for serious competition.

"I think that kitesurfing is a fantastic sport, but not (for) racing ... it's a new sport that is still not developed," Alabau

added.

"There isn't even (a uniform) design and I think that windsurfing is the best sailing sport, it's really exciting ... and there are a lot of countries that don't want the kites."

But she said that if kitesurfing was adopted, she would switch, as she and many others had gained experience in it.

After news of the decision broke, Israel's sailing chief Yehuda Maayan told Reuters that the ISAF decision to prefer kite boarding came about as a result of a voting error by the Spanish delegate at the ISAF conference.

The Spanish Sailing Federation subsequently admitted its mistake, saying its representative had wrongly voted in favour of kiteboarding.

"They said they made a mistake, but now they are going to realize that it was more than a mistake," said Alabau, Spain's only gold medallist at the Games so far.

France's Julien Bontemps, silver medal winner in the men's RS:X gold medal at the last Olympics in Beijing who finished fifth overall in Weymouth, added his voice to the chorus of windsurfers opposed to the switch.

"France is against the change. Does France want me to go to Rio on the windsurfing board? Yes for sure. In Rio there is no wind. If there is no wind there is no kites," he said.

GIVE IT A TRY

Dutchman Dorian van Rijsselberge, who won the gold medal in the men's competition, said had no strong feelings on which board he would prefer to use at the Rio Games.

"Everyone is enjoying themselves (windsurfing). I probably will go to California to try to get the hang of (kiteboarding). Why not?" he said.

But disappointed British windsurfer Bryony Shaw, who finished seventh overall, said the ISAF decision had been a "huge blow to the windsurfing community".

"We are one of the more spectacular (sailing) classes to watch ... and I don't think you are going to get the same visual image from kiting. It would be a huge loss if windsurfing doesn't stay in the Games," she said.
