Drayton: Junior sailors follow in wake of Shadden

One of the most competitive junior sailing series in Southern California is the Shadden Series. The Shadden is a four-day series at four sailing venues in Southern California: Newport Harbor, Marina del Rey, San Diego and Long Beach. The series is held each year on weekends between September and February in Flying Juniors, or CFJs, a popular double-handed sailboat with a main, jib and spinnaker.

The Shadden is named after John Shadden, a former top junior sailor from Long Beach who won sailing events at the high school, collegiate and Olympic levels. In the late 1970s, Shadden was one of the first juniors to win back-to-back Sabot championships.

CFJ sailboats near the Newport Wedge compete in last year's Shadden Series. The final race in this year's series is March 2-3 at Alamitos Bay Yacht Club.

Shadden went on to win the Youth World Sailing Championships in Laser-IIs – twice. He also was a top collegiate sailor at USC, and after he graduated, went on to win a silver medal at the 1988 Seoul Olympics.

The Shadden Series was started in 1991, and the winner's list reads like a who's who of top young Southern California sailors. It's well known that Southern Californian sailors have long been dominant at the high school and collegiate levels, so maybe it's not surprising that Shadden winners often go on to have top collegiate sailing careers.

This past weekend, Riley Gibbs posted an impressive 14-point total after four races. Like Shadden himself, Gibbs grew up sailing in Long Beach and is a former Sabot champion. In overall series standings, Marina del Rey's Christophe Weis leads after the third race of the series, but a sixth-place finish from this weekend could make him vulnerable for overall series honors.

Despite overcast weather and cool breezes, more than 40 teams traveled to San Diego to race in the third set for this year's Shadden.

As with past years, there are two obvious trends when scanning the top results. First, there are a lot of younger siblings, sons and daughters following in their family's footsteps. Family names like Hogan, Menninger, Barnard and Snow are repeatedly on the winner's list. A second trend is how many of the young sailors grow and mature in the sport. Younger sailors often start near the bottom of the Shadden as high school freshmen, and there often is measurable improvement for those who put in the extra work practicing and competing each year.

For another example of how participation in the Shadden Series tends to run in families, look no further than one of the top local boats. Newport Harbor High School's Sean Segerblom was sailing with Peyton Russell, who was third overall. Segerblom's older brother, Chris, was a two-time Shadden winner (2008-09), and Chris is now one of the top collegiate sailors on the Yale team. The Segerbloms' father, Mike, is coach of the USC sailing team. Mike Segerblom was one of John Shadden's 470 crews, and he also was a collegiate sailing teammate with Shadden at USC in the early 1980s.

The final race in this year's Shadden Series is scheduled for March 2-3 at Alamitos Bay Yacht Club


