R.I. Marine Companies honored by Sailing World

BRISTOL – Three Rhode Island companies – J/Boats, C&C Fiberglass Components and Bluenose Yacht Sales – were honored in Bristol on Friday for earning recognition in Sailing World magazine's Boat of the Year Awards.

Gov. Lincoln D. Chafee and U.S. Sen. Jack Reed joined the state's civic and marine industry leaders to celebrate the companies' national recognition.
